Methodology

Early in 2008, Nursing Professionals sent a survey out to 25,000 randomly selected hospital nurses throughout the country measuring their job satisfaction.

Some of the sample questions were:

- How well does your hospital manage personal training and development?
- Is your hospital a family-friendly employer?
- Does your hospital offer flexible working arrangements?
- Does your hospital promote equality and diversity in your nursing workforce?
- How strong is the nursing voice within your hospital on a scale of 1 through 10?

With a total of five data research associates compiling the return surveys, we have our 2009 Top 100 Hospitals to Work For.
