

**Chip Souba, MD, ScD, Interim CEO, OSUMC;
Dean, OSU College of Medicine**

Wiley W. "Chip" Souba Jr. is Interim CEO of the Ohio State University Medical Center and Dean of the College of Medicine. Before taking his leadership position at OSU Medical Center in August 2006, Souba was chair of surgery at Penn State's College of Medicine and surgeon-in-chief at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center. Souba was also director of the Penn State Hershey Center for Leadership Development and holder of the John A. and Marian T. Waldhausen Professorship in surgery at Penn State.

Souba earned his medical degree at the University of Texas Medical School in Houston, a doctor of science degree in nutritional biochemistry at the Harvard School of Public Health, and a bachelor's degree in chemistry at Muskingum College in New Concord, Ohio. He also holds an MBA from Boston University School of Management and has published articles and delivered numerous invited lectures on specific aspects of leadership within an academic medicine environment. In 2003-2004, he worked with Edward Miller, dean and CEO of Johns Hopkins Medicine, as part of an Association of American Medical Colleges fellowship program to develop future leaders in academic medicine.

Souba began his professional career training as a resident at the University of Texas at Houston, and with fellowships at Brigham and Women's Hospital, Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and M.D. Anderson Hospital. He joined the University of Florida faculty as an assistant professor of surgery, becoming a full professor by the time he joined Harvard and Massachusetts General Hospital in 1993 as professor of surgery and nutrition and chief of surgical oncology, respectively. He also served on the executive committee of Dana-Farber/Partners CancerCare. In 1999, he joined Penn State, where, in addition to being chair of surgery, he has also served as interim director of the Penn State Cancer Institute, professor of cellular and molecular physiology, member of the Milton Hershey Medical Center Board of Trustees, and as a leader of institution teams overseeing campus human resources and finances.
